Florence, June 22, N. S.

THEY write from Ravenna, that Cardinal Alberoni, the Legate there, had ordered the Marquels Rasponi (for having cast some Reflections on him) to leave that District in 24 Hours; which he neglecting to do, and retiring to his Villa about eight Miles from Ravenna, with his Domesticks, the Cardinal ordered him to be taken into Custody; in endeavouring to execute which Orders, the Bargello and five of his Men were killed on the Spot: The Marquels is since fled to Venice.

Paris, July 16, N. S. Our last Advices from the Army of the Allies in Italy are of the 4th Instant, and import, that Count Konigsfegg having abandoned all the Places he was possessed of in that Country, leaving only Garrisons in Mantua and Mirandola, and having retired, with the rest of the Imperial Forces, to Tyrol; the King of Sardinia, the Marshal de Noailles, and the Duke de Montemar, had thought fit for the present to order their Troops into Quarters of Refreshment in the Upper and Lower Mantuan: The French, Spaniards, and Piemontese being cantoned severally in different Parts of the Country. The King of Sardinia had taken his Head Quarters at St. Martin de Bozolo, the Marshal de Noailles at Castiglion del Stivere, and the Duke de Montemar at San Benedetto; the Marquels de Maillebois remaining in the Seraglio with the Body of Reserve he commands. Our freshest Letters from the King's Army commanded by the Marshal de Coigny, are of the 9th Instant, when they continued on this Side of the Rhine, as did Prince Eugene with the Imperialists on the other, without seeming determined yet on either side upon any great Enterprize.

Hanover, July 17, N. S. On Thursday last M. Wachtendonk, Minister from the Elector Palatine, who is come to compliment his Majesty on the part of his Master, had his Audience of the King at Herrenhausen; as had likewise M. de Behr, who came upon the same Errand from the Nobility of Mecklenbourg.
