Paris, Aug. 20, N. S. Our last Advices from the Army of the Allies in Italy are of the 8th Instant: Their Troops remained in Quarters of Refreshment in the Upper and Lower Mantuan, and in the Seraglio. The Imperialists, fince they retired into Tirol, have cantoned their Horse in several Places between Brixen and Tirol, and on the Lest of the Head of the Lake of Garda; Part of their Foot was quartered within the same Extent of Territory, and the rest in different Posts from Borghetto and Mount Balda to Trent. A Body of Spaniards commanded by the Count de Maceda was employed in the Siege of Mirandola, in which little Progress had yet been made.
