The States of the Province of Holland will separate To-morrow: The Answer they expected from the Allies against the Emperour, upon the last Propositions of Peace, is not yet arrived. We have Advices from the Body of Forces commanded by Count Seckendors, dated the 9th Instant: He was then at Simmeren, and proposed to march on the 10th to Berncastle on the Moselle, having passed through the Honsruck without any Opposition from the French.
