The Count de Montijo proposes to set out from hence on the 12th Instant for Paris. M. d'Osorio, and M. d'Assevedo, will proceed from hence for London by the next Packet-The Prussian Minister has newly prefented a Memorial to the States, requiring Copies of the Writings which relate to the Inheritance of Orange, which has been granted.
