Florence, November 26, N. S.

ON the 24th arrived here an Officer from the Duke de Montemar, to inform the Great Duke of the Reasons which had induced him to retire into Tuscany with Part of the Spanish Forces he commands, and to desire that Orders might be given for providing Quarters for them. Part of those Troops arrived Yesterday in the Neighbourhood of this Place, and the Duke de Montemar is expected Tomorrow at Cupoli, where he designs to fix his Head Quarters.

Parma, Nov. 30, N. S. The greatest Part of the Spanish Forces which were in this Dutchy and that of Placentia, are on the March to Tuscany; whither also are ordered some Regiments of Horse which arrived lately from Spain on the Coast of Genoa.

Warsaw, Nov. 30, N. S. A Messenger has been sent to Petersbourg, for the Approbation of that Court of what M. Keyerling has regulated with the Commissaries of the Republick; and the Prince of Hesse Hombourg has given Orders for 22000 Russians to prepare for their March to leave this Country, the 5000 designed for the Emperor being included; the Body of Russians which

remains here, will consist of eight Regiments, three of Cuirassiers, three of Dragoons, and two of Infantry, besides a Detachment of Collacks under the Command of Major General Bismark. The Poles have agreed to pay Monthly for the Subsistence of the said Body the Value of about 10000 Ducats. The Prince of Hesse Hombourg went away Yesterday for his Quarters near Lublin, from whence he intends to go directly to Petersbourg. Yesterday the Conferences began with the Duke of Weissenfelds concerning the Saxon Troops. Count Potocki, Palatin of Volhinia, arrived here on Sunday last, and had an Audience Yesterday of King Augustus; 40 Prussian Dragoons were dispatched after him as soon as his Design of coming hither was known, but to no Purpose. According to News from the Frontiers of the King of Prussia's Dominions, a Russian Detachment had surprized the advanc'd Guard of M. Paskowski, who retired to the Corpiques in the Woods of Lumza, Prosnicz, and Ostralika, with Major General Steinfleet, took 15 Prisoners, and killed some few; they have surrounded M. Paskowski in such a Manner, that it is thought he will be obliged to surrender. Colonel Fleming, Adjutant General of King Augustus, arrived Yesterday from the Imperial Army on the Moselle.
