Florence, November 26, N. S.

N the 24th arrived here an Officer from the Duke de Montemar, to inform the Great Duke of the Reafons which had induced him to retire into Tufcany with Part of the Spanifh Forces he commands, and to defire that Orders might be given for providing Quarters for them. Part of thole Troops arrived Yefterday in the Neighbourhood of this Place, and the Duke de Montemar is expected Tomorrow at Cupoli, where he defigns to fix his Head Quarters.

Parma, Nov. 30, N. S. The greatest Part of the Spanish Forces which were in this Dutchy and that of Placentia, are on the March to Tuscany; whither also are ordered some Regiments of Horse which arrived Mately from Spain on the Coast of Genoa.

Warfaw, Nov. 30, N. S. A Meisenger has been sent to Petersbourg, for the Approbation of that Court of what M. Keyserling has regulated with the Commission of the Republick; and the Prince of Helle Hombourg has given Orders for 22000 Ruffians to prepare for their March to leave this Country, the 5000 defigned for the Emperor being included; the Body of Ruffians which

remains here, will confift of eight Regiments, three of Cuiraffiers, three of Dra-goons, and two of Infantry, befides a De-tachment of Coffacks under the Command of Major General Bifmark. The Poles have agreed to pay Monthly for the Subliftance of the faid Body the Value of about 10000 Du-The Prince of Helle Hombourg went cats. away Yesterday for his Quarters near Lublin, from whence he intends to go directly to Pe-tersbourg. Yefterday the Conferences began with the Duke of Weiffenfelds concerning the Saxon Troops. Count Potocki, Palatin of Volhinia, arrived here on Sunday last, and had an Audience Yesterday of King Augustus; 40 Pruffian Dragoons were dispatched after him as soon as his Design of coming hitherwas known, but to no Purpole. According to News from the Frontiers of the King of Prussia's Dominions, a Russian Detachment had furprized the advanc'd Guard of M. Pafkowski, who retired to the Corpiques in the Woods of Lumza, Profnicz, and Oftralika, with Major General Steinfleet, took 15 Prifoners, and killed fome few ; they have fur-rounded M. Paskowski in luch a Manner, that it is thought he will be obliged to furrender. Colonel Fleming, Adjutant General. of King Augustus, arrived Yesterday from the
