The fame Day the Pope's Nuncio had his Audience of the King, and delivered his Credential Letter.

Vienna, Jan. 18, N.S. A Courier fent in all Hafte from Conftantinople by M. Tahl-man, has brought News of the deposing of the new Grand Vizier, but without any particular Account of the Reasons of such an unexpected Change in the Turkish Government. Prince Charles of Lorrain, who arrived on the 19th Inftant, is lodged at the Court, and fups with the Imperial Family.
