Warsaw, Feb. 1, N. S. The Palatin of Lublin having, a few Days ago, sent to desire a Passport for his repairing safely hither, it was presently dispatched to him by a Messenger, so that he is daily expected. The Departure of the Prince of Hesse Hombourg with the Russian Troops, is deferred till the 6th Instant. The Starosta Belski, who was of King Stanislaus's Party, and one of those who retired into Turkey, arrived here some Days ago, and appears to be very zealous for King Augustus. This Day being the Anniversary of the Death of the late King Augustus, it was observed here with great Solemnity.

Vienna, Feb. 3, N. S. Yesterday the Duke of Lorraine demanded in Person of the Emperour and Empress, the Archduchess Maria Theresia in Marriage, which was granted by their Imperial Majesties in the most gracious Manner, and with Expressions of high Esteem for him: Then his Royal Highness waited on the Archduchess his future Consort, and afterwards went to the Apartment of the Empress Dowager Amelia, to make the proper Compliments to her: On this Occasion there was a very numerous and splendid Appearance at Court of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction of both Sexes: And the Imperial Family dined in Publick with the Duke of Lorraine and Prince Charles his Brother. It is advised from Italy, that upon Assurances given by the Duke de Montemar, that the Court of Madrid will acquiesce with the Preliminaries of Peace, the Count de Kevenhuller had nominated the Generals Watchendonck, Brown, and Brettwitz, to be Imperial Commissioners, to settle with those of Spain the Terms of a Prolongation of the Suspension of Arms.

Berlin, Feb. 4, N. S. A Marriage is agreed between the Princess Ulrica, their Prussian Majesties Fifth Daughter, and Margrave

Charles, eldest Son of the late Margrave Albert, and Preparations are making for the Ceremony of their Betrothing. The King of Prussia went Yesterday to Potzdam, as did this Afternoon the Queen of Prussia with the Royal Family, which usually accompanies her on these Journeys.

Hague, Feb. 14, N. S. The Emperor's Minister Count Uhlefeld treated at Dinner Yesterday with great Magnificence several of the chief Persons in the Regency of this State, and Foreign Ministers, on Occasion of the Marriage of the Duke of Lorraine with the Archduchess their Imperial Majesties eldest Daughter: To Day the French Ambassadour, and the Saxon Minister, have severally treated at Dinner a good Number of Persons of Distinction of both Sexes, on the same Occasion; and to Night Count Uhlefeld gives a Ball. Count Stareinberg, Son of the Count of that Name who some time ago was the Emperor's Minister at the Court of Great Britain, and a young Bavarian Count, are arrived here, designing to go over to England.
