OUNT Wartenfleben, who has quitted the Pruffian Service, is arrived here, and has been very gracioufly received by the King of Denmark. He was admitted to an Audience of his Danish Majesty alone, and has dined fince at his Majefty's Table, as well as at that of the Prince Royal. He feems defigned for fome Em-ployment of Truft, and it is not unlikely that he may fucceed General Schulembourg in the Post of Envoy at the French Court. There is the greatest Probability that the King of Denmark will take a Progress this Summer into Holstein, both to review his Troops at their Return from the Rhine, and to reconduct the Princels Dowager of Ooftfrile fome Part of the Way on her Return to Aurich.

The States of Hague, Feb. 17, N. S. Holland are fummoned to meet on Wednef-day next, on Occafion, as 'tis faid, of the Declarations fent by M. Bruyninx from Vienna, of the Emperour and the French Cog on the Part of his Catholick Majesty, relating to the Preliminaries of Peace; and also to take further into Confideration the Affair rela-ting to the Succeffion of Juliers and Bergue. Thirteen Ships of our East India Fleet having lately failed for the Indies, met with a Storm, feven of them are returned to the Texel, five continued their Courfe, and one was loft upon the Sand called the Haaks. The Im-perial, French, and Saxon Ministers made publick Entertainments on Monday and Tuefday last, on Occasion of the Marriage between the Duke of Lorrain and the Archdutchefs. Prince George of Heffe Caffel is daily expected here from Caffel.
