Vienna Feb. 15, N. S. On Sunday the 12th Instant, the Duke of Lorraine, accompanied by Prince Charles his Brother, returned hither from Presburg at Five in the Evening. It is adviced from Constantinople, that Sir Everard Fawkner, Ambassadour from his Britannick Majesty to the Porte, arrived there on the 30th of December.
