Vienna Feb. 15, N. S. On Sunday the 12th Instant, the Duke of Lorraine, accompanied by Prince Charles his Brother, returned hither from Presburg at Five in the Evening. At Seven their Imperial Majesties, with the whole Court, went from the Palace to the Aulick Church of the Augustin Fryars, where the Ceremony of the Marriage of the Duke of Lorraine with the Archduchess Maria Theresa, was performed by Sig. Passionei, the Pope's Nuncio. The Imperial Family, the Bride and Bridegroom, and all the Persons of Quality who appeared on this Occasion, were in most magnificent Habits. It is adviced from Constantinople, that Sir Everard Fawkner, Ambassadour from his Britannick Majesty to the Porte, arrived there on the 30th of December.
