The 17th Instant, a Courier was fent to General Lacy, who is with the Rullian Troops near Prague, to inform him, that her Czarith Majefty has been pleafed to promote him to the Rank of a Felt-Marshal: He is by Birth an Irishman, and is looked upon as the best Officer in this Country.

Berlin, March 17, N. S. On the 7th In-ftant, the King of Prussia came to Town from Potzdam; and the next Day Baron Demeradt, the Imperial Minister, and Count Althan, the Duke of Lorrain's Chamber-lain, had jointly an Audience of his Pruffian Majesty, in which they delivered the Notifications they were charged with from their respective Masters, of the Marriage lately celebrated between the Duke of Lorrain and the Archdutchels Maria Therela. These Gentlemen had afterwards the Honour to dine with his Pruffian Majefty; and as this was the only Business which brought the King to Town, he returned to Potzdam again imme-diately after Dinner. Count Althan having on the 10th received an Answer to the Letter of Notification which he prefented to his Prussian Majesty, together with a Present of his Prussian Majesty's Picture fet with Dia-monds to the Value of 2000 Dollars, set out on the 12th for Wolfenbuttel, being charged with the like Committion of Notification to that Court.
