KING Stanislaus is now expected here in a very few Days; travelling incognito under the Name of the Count de Ligny; He is to lie at the Marquês de la Chetardie's, the French Minister. The Day after his Arrival, the King of Prussia is to dine there, and the same Evening the Queen is to appear at Court, where, they say, King Stanislaus will be desired to come and sup with her Prussian Majesty; and that the next Morning he will proceed on his Journey.
