Warsaw, April 4, N. S.

ON the 24th of last Month a full Assembly of the Senators and Members of the general Confederation for King Stanislaus was held here; M. Poninski, Marshal of that Confederation, presiding in it. The Great Chancellor and the other chief Officers and Ministers of the Crown and of Lithuania were present. And the King having consented that the Equestrian Order might Vote in the said Assembly, the following Resolutions proposed by the Crown were considered and approved, viz. That an extraordinary Diet, to last a Fortnight, shall be summoned to meet at Warsaw the 25th of June, for settling a general Pacification: That Conferences shall in the mean while be held with the Pope's Nuncio for accommodating all Differences with the Court of Rome; and with the Minister of the Czarina, for withdrawing all the Russian Troops out of this Kingdom immediately after the Pacification shall be fixed; the King renewing his Promise that his Saxon Troops shall then also depart the Kingdom. We have received Advice from Königsberg, that on the 27th of last Month, King Stanislaus left that Place for Kösling. M. Mosinski, Treasurer of the Court, having received a Letter from the Great Treasurer M. Ofalinski, desiring to have an Interview with him at Angerbourg, where King Stanislaus makes some Stay till Satisfaction be agreed to be made him for his Estates in Poland, he set out some Days ago from hence, with Permission of this Court, and Instructions to treat for the purchasing of those Estates. Some Days ago M. Shemberg, with several others that belong to the Mines in Saxony, arrived here in their Way to Petersbourg, the

Czarina having asked them of King Augustus, in hopes of discovering Silver Mines in Siberia. It is assured here, that the Palatin of Lublin is to be appointed Palatin of Sendomir, and that M. Afhelski, who was Marshal of the Confederation of Dzikow, is to succeed him as Palatin of Lublin.

Gotha, April 14, N. S. On Thursday last the Princess Augusta, and the Dutches Dowager her Mother, returned to Altenbourg, where her Sister the Dutches of Saxe Weissenfels is to come to take her Leave of her. Her Highness's Return to this Place is fixed for the 26th, and she will stay here the 27th, and set out on her Journey for England the 28th Instant, N. S.

Hague, April 17, N. S. The States had an Account some Days ago of the Death of M. du Portal, Governor of Ypres, and they disposed the same Day of his Place in Behalf of M. de Cronstrom, whose Government of Furnes was bestowed upon Baron Swartzenbourg. By the Death of the said M. du Portal there is a Regiment of Dragoons vacant, which is in the Disposal of the States of Holland. The said States of Holland separated on Saturday last, to meet again this Day Seven-night: They are not come to any Resolution yet as to the Project for increasing the Waters in the Neighbourhood of Dort, Goreum making great Opposition to that Project. M. Gaslinot, the Palatine Minister, has declared to the States, that the Money lately seized with other Goods passing through the Dominions of the Elector his Master shall be forthwith restored to the Owners. Count Canales, Minister from the King of Sardinia, is recalled, and is to be succeeded here by M. de Chavane, who is at present charged with the Affairs of his Sardinian Majesty at the Court of Madrid.
