Copenhagen, August 11, N. S. Fifterday there was a Council held at Friedensburgh, but as the King had declared his Intention of not appearing in Publick, none but the Mini-ftry went to pay their Court. The excellive Heat of the Weather is by fome given as the Reafon of his Majesty's not coming out into the Circle, or dining as usual in Publick, but others think he has again felt fome Return of his Diftemper; the rather, becaule on the 9th Inftant two Phylicians of the Town were called in to join in a Confultation with those who conflantly attend upon his Majefty. the King of Denmark palled through the Island of Fuhnen, on his Return from Holftein, he gave Orders that the Marriage of M. Juel, one of his Majefty's Chamberlains, with the Counters Frife, thould be celebrated in the Palace of Odensee; and was so gra-cious as to affift at the Ceremony with his whole Court.

Drefden, Aug. 11. The King and Queen arrived here from Warlaw on the 7th Instant, upon which Occafion Illuminations and publick Rejoycings have been made three Nights fucceffively.

Berlin, Aug. 12. The King returned hither from his Progress to Prussia on the 8th Instant, and this Morning set out for Potsdam. It is faid his Majesty designs to go in Perfon to view the Damage done by the late overflowing of the River Oder. General Ginkel, Minister from the States General of the United Provinces to this Court, having obtained their High Mightineffes Leave to take a Turn to Holland for fome Months on his private Affairs, has had an Audience of Leave of his Pruffian Majefty. Baron Brackel, the Russian Minister here, has this Day received by an Express from his Court, Advice, that Felt Marshal Count Munich has possifief-fed himself of Bacciesaray, the Capital City of the Crimee, and of feveral other Places; and made no Doubt of compleating very foon the entire Conquest of the Crimee.
