THE Ague feems now to have entirely left his Danish Majesty : For these eight or ten Days past he bas regularly milled his it; and it is hoped his Majefty will foon Recover his former State of Health. King Staniflaus has been acknowledged by this Court, King of Poland, in the fame Manner as other Powers have done; and M. Berenfdorff, the Danish Envoy at Drefden, has had Orders fent to him, to the fame Effect with Regard to King Augustus. M. During, who was Aide de Camp to the late King of Sweden, and af-terwards received his Difinition from that Prince's Service, with the Character of Colonel; is now come hither, with a View, as it is generally supposed, of getting into Employment here.

Vienna, Aug. 25, N. S. A Courier arri-ved Yesterday Morning with Letters from Count Kevenhuller of the 17th Instant, to acquaint this Court, that he had had a Conference on the 15th with M. de Noailles, and was to have another, which would be final, in a few Days; that every thing was prepa-ring for the Evacuation of the Milaneze gradually by the French and Piedmontefe Troops, and for a like gradual and fucceflive Entrance of the Imperialist. The King of Sardinia was for having the 30th fixed for putting the Troops into Motion; but M. de Noailles proposed a shorter Day, and it is thought here, that the feveral Marches will be begun as this Day. There is Advice also by private Letters, that M. de Montemar has actually received Orders for a like Evacuation of Tufcany, in Confequence of what it is affured has been agreed upon with M. de Vaugrenant the French Minister in Spain, but Count Kevenhuller had had no Notice of it from either M. de Noailles or M. de Montemar. The long expected Courier from Mufsovy, who it is supposed may bring the Resolutions of her Czarish Majesty with respect to the Terms upon which she will be willing to treat with the Turks, is not yet arrived here; and we begin now to think, that the Muf-covites will not declare their Intentions upon that Head, till they fhall fee what Pro-

pofals the Turks may be willing to make. Hague, Sept. 7, N. S. The States of Hol-land will affemble on Wednefday next, in order to dispose of all the Civil and Military Employments that are vacant within their Province, as is usually done at this Time of the Year. Count d'Uhlefeld, the Emperor's Minister, set out this Morning for Vienna, and will return within fix Weeks, having Leave from his Court for no longer Time. M. Imberti fets out on the 9th Inftant for Venice. The Prince of Orange with his Confort the Princefs Royal, are expected here in a few Days.

Hanover, Sept. 4, N.S. Preparations are making here for a grand Hunting Match, which his Majefty intends to take the Diverfion of, at a Place called Bahrenbruch, near Gifthorn, about five German Miles from hence, and to proceed from thence to the Gohrde.
