An Ast to prevent the Inconveniencies arising from seducing Artificers in the Manusactures of Great Britain into Foreign Parts, it is enasted, That, Whereas by the Practice of inveigling the Manusacturers of Great Britain into foreign Countries, there is great Danger, that many great and prostable Branches of the Trades, and Manusacturies of this Kingdom, may be transplanted into those Parts; if therefore any Person or Persons, shall, at any Time thereafter, contrast with, entice, endeavour to persuade, or solicit any Manusacturer or Artisicer of, or in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brass, or any other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artisicer of this Kingdom into any foreign Country out of this Kingdom into any foreign Country out of this Kingdom into any foreign Country out of this Kingdom into any som not exceeding 100 l. and be imprisoned for three Months, and until the said Fine be paid, for the sirft Offence; and for the Sacond, be fined at the Discretion of the Court where he or they shall be sequisted, and imprisoned twelve Months, and till the said Fine be paid.

And it is farther enacted, that any Artificer, or Manufacturer, so going abroad, and there using, exercising, or teaching any Trade or Manufactury to Foreigners, if he does not return into this Reahn within six Months next after warning shall be given to him by the Ambassador, Envoy, Resident, Minister, or Consul of the Crown of Great Britain, in the Country in which such Artiscer shall be, or by any Person authorized by such Ambassador, Envoy, Resident, Minister, or Consul, or by one of his Majessy's Secretaries of State for the Time being, and from thenceforth continually inhabit, and dwell within this Realm, then, and in such Case, every such Person or Persons shall be from thenceforth incapable of taking any Legacy that shall be devised to him within this Kingdom, or of being an Executor or Administrator to any Person or Persons within this Kingdom, and shall be incapable of taking any Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments within this Kingdom, by Descent, Devise, or Purchase; and also forfeit all his Lands, Tenements, Hereditaments, Goods and Chattels, within this Kingdom, to his Majessy's Use, and shall from thenceforth be, and be deemed and taken to be, an Alien, and shall be out of his Majessy's Protection.

And it is likewise enacted, that any Justice of Peace, having Notice upon Oath that any Person or Persons is so seducing and drawing away any of the said Artiscers or Manusacturers into foreign Parts, or of any such Artiscer or Manusacturer having contracted, promised, or being preparing to go out of his Majesty's Dominions for the Purposes abovementioned, may bring the said Person or Persons before him by Warrant, and upon Proof or Confession of the Fact, may bind him or them over to appear and answer the Premisses at the next Assizes, general Goal Delivery, or Quarter Sessions of the Peace, for the County, City, Riding, or Division, where such Offence shall be committed; and in Case of refusal or neglect to give proper Security for such Appearance, may commit the said Person or Persons to the County Goal, there to be kept until the next Assizes, or next Quarter Sessions of the County, City, Riding, or Division, where such Commitment shall be, at the Election of such Fusice of the Peace, and until he, she, or they shall be delivered by due Course of Law; and that in Case any such Artiscer or Manusacturer shall be convicted of any such Promiseor Contract, or Preparation to go abroad beyond the Seas, for any of the Purposes aforesaid, then, and in such Case, the Person so convict shall give such Security to his Majesty, his Heirs and Successors, not to depart out of his Majesty's Dominions for any the Purposes aforesaid, as such Court shall think reasonable, and shall



be imprisoned until such Security shall be

given.
