Berlin, January 22, N. S.

THE Marquês de la Chetardie having been at Potzdam to communicate to his Pruffian Majesty the Sentiments of the Court of France upon the Affair of the Succession of Bergue and Juliers, returned hither the 20th Instant, and has since had two Conferences with the Pruffian Ministers. The first was to make to them the same Communication as he had done to the King their Master. In the second he laid before them some Complaints which he had received from his Court, concerning some Practices of Pruffian Officers in several Provinces of France, to list Men into the Pruffian Service.

Hague, Jan. 29, N. S. The Prince of Orange has deferred his Departure for Friesland to Monday or Tuesday next. He designs to go first to Enkhuyfen, and from thence to pass over to Friesland. Mr. Robinson, his Britannick Majesty's Minister to the Court of Vienna, is expected here to Night in his Return from thence by the Way of Dresden, in order to embark for England.

The King has been pleased to constitute and appoint Thomas Mathews, Esq; to be one of his Majesty's Commissioners in Quality of a Principal Officer of his Majesty's Navy, for the Affairs of his Majesty's Yards at Chatham and Sheerness.
