**T**HE Project for setting up a Bank at Copenhagen has been so little mentioned of late, that People began to think it would be pursued no farther, but on the 23d a general Assembly was held at Charlottenburg, when the Book-keeper, Cashire, and several under Officers were chosen. It was also agreed, that the first Payment of the Subscription shall be from the End of February to the 11th of March, at which Time the Bank is to be opened. The Storm which happened on the 21st Instant, and was the most violent that has been felt here for many Years, has done considerable Damage both by Sea and Land. The Charlotte, a Frigate of 30 Guns, which guarded the Passage of the Sound, was driven from her Anchors, and being carried up beyond Copenhagen as far as the Isle of Salt-holm, struck there upon the Sands, and is since lost, but the Men and the Guns have all been saved. 'Tis said upwards of 20 Sail are stranded upon the Swedish Coast, mostly belonging to that Nation, and to the Dutch. This Town escaped pretty well, but all Advices from the Country speak of terrible Havock among the Villages, and a great Destruction of Cattle, occasioned by the blowing down of Houses, Barns, and Stables. M. John, late his Danish Majesty's Minister at the Court of Great Britain, was admitted to a private Audience of the King of Denmark on the 23d. He has appeared but little abroad yet since his Return hither, being very much indisposed.

*Hague, Feb. 1, N. S.* The Prince of Orange being resolv'd to set out, with her Royal Highness his Consort, for Friesland on Monday next, went this Morning to take his Leave of the several Colleges, who sent their Presidents afterwards to compliment him and her Royal Highness, and wish them a happy Voyage. M. de Ginkel, who has been here some Time, having desired to be excused from returning to the Court of Berlin in the Quality of Minister from the States, has obtained his Request. Mr. Robinson is arrived at Utrecht, and is expected here To-morrow Morning.
