The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

This Day the most Reverend Father in God John Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and the Right Honourable Sir John Willes, Knight, Lord Chief Justice of His Majesty's Court of Common Pleas, were, by His Majesty's Command, Sworn of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, and took their respective Places at the Board accordingly.

*Petersbourg*, Feb. 19. Before Felt Marshal Munich left this Place, he made a general Plan of Operations for the next Campaign, which was to be changed by this Ministry according as the Turks and Court of Vienna should take Measures for War or for Peace. It is assured that in Case the War continues, the Russians will again attack the Crimea, though it is feared they may meet with a greater Opposition this Year in that Country than they did the last; but on the other Hand it is said they have now taken such Precautions that they think they cannot fail of Success. We have Advice from M. Calkoen, the Czarina's Minister at the Porte, that the Turks have named three Plenipotentiaries to go to Saroka on the Borders of Moldavia, to be ready to treat with the Russians in case they send Ministers to meet them: If this be the real Disposition of the Porte, we may soon see a happy End put to the War, this Court being not averle to the making up Matters upon reasonable Terms.

*Hambourg*, March 19. The Bishop of Lubeck having accepted an Invitation given his Highness by Sir Cyril Wich, Bart. his Britannick Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary to the Circle of Lower Saxony, to spend some Days at his Estate in Holstein, and take the Diversion of Hunting there, Sir Cyril sets out from hence this Evening in order to go thither and make Preparations for his Highness's Reception, and proposes to return again to this City by the 25th Instant.
