Whitehall, June 25, 1737.

Whereas it has been repreſented to the King, That
Richard Turpin did, on Wednesday the Fourth Day of
May laſt, barbarouſly murder Thomas Morris, Servant
to Henry Tomſon, one of the Keepers of Epping Foreſt; and
that the ſaid Richard Turpin hath, at divers
Times, committed ſeveral notorious Felonies and Robberies
in and near the ſaid Foreſt, and other Places near
the Cities of London and Weſtminſter; His Maſteſty, for
the better diſcovering and bringing the ſaid Richard
Turpin to Juſtice, is pleaſed to promiſe his moſt gracious
Pardon to any one of the accomplices of the ſaid Richard
Turpin, who ſhall diſcover him, ſo that he may be
apprehended and convicted of any of the ſaid Offences.
And as a further Encouragement, his Maſteſty is pleaſed
to promiſe a Reward of Two Hundred Pounds to any
Perſon or Perſons who ſhall diſcover the ſaid Criminal,
ſo as he may be apprehended and convicted as afore-
ſaid, to be paid upon ſuch Conviction, over and above
all other Rewards to which the ſaid Perſon or Perſons
may otherwiſe be entitled.

HOLLES NEWCASTLE.

The ſaid Richard Turpin was born at Thackſted, in
the County of Eſſex, is about Thirty Years of Age, by
Trade a Butcher, about Five Feet Nine Inches high, of
a brown Complexion, very much marked with the Small
Pox, his Cheek bones broad, his Face thinner towards
the Bottom, his Viſage ſhort, pretty upright, and broad
about the Shoulders.

Whitehall, June 13, 1737.

Whereas an anonymous Letter was lately received by
the Right Honourable the Lord Cornbury, directed to
him at the Earl of Clarndine's Houſe in St. James's
Square, London, (which Letter is ſuppoſed to have
been written by Perſons concerned in ſtealing Deer in
his Maſteſty's Foreſt of Whichwood, in the County of
Oxford) threatening to deſtroy the Houſes and Stables
of the ſaid Lord Cornbury, and alſo to take away his
Life, if he ſhould not comply with what is therein de-
ſired: His Maſteſty, for the better diſcovering and
bringing to Juſtice the Perſon or Perſons concerned in
the writing or ſending the abovementioned Letter, is
pleaſed to promiſe his moſt gracious Pardon to any one
of them, who ſhall diſcover his Accomplice or Accom-
plices, ſo as he or they may be apprehended and con-
victed thereof; and alſo a Reward of Fifty Pounds
to ſuch Perſon or Perſons making ſuch Diſcovery as a-
foreſaid, payable upon the Conviction of ſuch Offender or
Offenders.
