**S**INCE the Removal of the Court to Friedensbourg, the Margravine has had two Fits, which by the Description given of them, seem to have been Apoplectick. After Bleeding, as is usual in such Cases, she grew better, and according to the News we had Yesterday, found herself then tolerably well; but it was apprehended that this Disorder might occasion the Return of her Fever. They continue here very attentive to prevent the bringing in of any Infection. Two Brigantines are now fitting out, one of which is to lie in this Road, and the other in the Great Belt, to see that the Orders for Quarantain are duly observed.
