Vienna, August 3, N. S.

Yesterday came Advice by an Express, that Field Marshal Count Philippi, with a Detachment of Count Seckendorff's Army, consisting of six Regiments of Horse, 500 Hussars, 2000 Granadiers, and six Field Pieces, being advanced to Nissa, sent a Trumpet to the Bashaw commanding in the Place, to summon him to surrender without Delay. The Bashaw demanded 20 Days for sending to the Grand Vizier and receiving his Orders; but Count Philippi returned Answer, that if he did not give up the Place in 24 Hours, he must expect no Quarter for himself, his Garrison or the Inhabitants; adding, that the great Army of the Imperialists would quickly come before the Place. Field Marshal Count Seckendorff having received Advice from Count Philippi how Things stood, made all the Haste he could with his Army, and appeared before the Town, but without his Artillery: But the Bashaw, not staying for his Arrival, had already made a Capitulation with Count Philippi on the 25th of July. On the 28th Count Seckendorff took Possession of the Place, in which were found 150 Brass Cannon and Mortars, with great Stores of Ammunition and Provisions.

Hague, Aug. 16, N. S. On the 12th Instant Count Golowin, the Czarina's Ambassadour, communicated to the States General an Account which he had received, importing, that Felt Marshal Count Munich being arrived with the Army of Russians under his Command before Oczakow, made the necessary Dispositions for attacking the Place, which was defended by a Garrison of about 17000 Janissaries. That having carried on his Approaches towards the Outworks, consisting of fortified Lines and Intrenchments, he made an Assault upon them on the 12th of July, beat the Enemy out of them, and advanced to the Counterscarp. Animated with this Success, he resolved to make a general Attack on the 13th; and having, after a sharp Dispute, gained the Pa-

lisadoes, the Turks hung out a White Flag upon the Walls and capitulated, and the same Day he took Possession of the Place. In the Action a great Number of the Turks, who made an obstinate Defence, were killed: The Loss of the Russians was also considerable. The said Ambassadour Count Golowin notified at the same Time to the States General, that General Lacy, with a Body of Russians, had entred the Crimea, not by the Isthmus of Perecop, where the Cham of the Tartars had expected him, and drawn together a Body of his Forces to oppose him, but by crossing an Arm of the Sea at Cadzis, which some Muscovite Officers had discovered in the last Year's Expedition to be fordable.
