· Petersbourg, Sept. 3. Felt Marshal Mu-nich continues still with the greatest Part of his Army on this Side the River Bog; and Felt Marshal Lacy is still encamped on the North Side of the Gnilo-More, ready to re-enter the Crimea, or to join Felt Marihal Munich's Army, in Cafe they fhould refolve to make any other Expedition this Year. All the Foreign Minifters and Ruffian Nobility were invited the 28th of last Month to come to Court in the Morning, where there was a magnificent Entertainment, and at Night a Ball, on Account of the good Suc-cels her Majefty's Forces have had this Campaign over the Turks and Tartars.
