Petersbourg, August 27.

LAST Sunday, being the 21st Instant, her Czarish Majesty went to Church with a great Train, to return Thanks to God for the good Success of her Arms over the Turks and Tartars; and all the great Guns of the Citadel and Admiralty were fired. The same Day her Majesty was pleased to make young Count Munich one of her Chamberlains.

Petersbourg, Sept. 3. Felt Marshal Munich continues still with the greatest Part of his Army on this Side the River Bog; and Felt Marshal Lacy is still encamped on the North Side of the Gnilo-More, ready to re-enter the Crimea, or to join Felt Marshal Munich's Army, in Case they should resolve to make any other Expedition this Year. All the Foreign Ministers and Russian Nobility were invited the 28th of last Month to come to Court in the Morning, where there was a magnificent Entertainment, and at Night a Ball, on Account of the good Success her Majesty's Forces have had this Campaign over the Turks and Tartars.
