IT is now said that the Operations of this Campaign are ended, it being reported that Felt Marshal Lacy is marching with his Army to Backmuth in the Ukraine; and as Count Munich has already sent back all his Cavalry and heavy Artillery, it is suppos'd he will soon return to the Ukraine with his Infantry.

Berlin, Oct. 12, N. S. Baron Keyserling, the Czarina's Minister Plenipotentiary to the King and Republick of Poland, passed through this Town a few Days ago in his Way to Dantzick, whither he is going to assist as the Duke of Courland's Commissary, at a Commission which is to be held there, in Consequence of the Resolutions taken at the Diet of Pacification, and the Senatus Concilium, at Fraustadt, relating to the Affairs of Courland.

Whitehall, October 11.

This Day being the Anniversary of their Majesties Coronation, there was a numerous and splendid Appearance at Hampton Court of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction. At Noon the Guns in St. James's Park and at the Tower were fired; and at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, Ringing of Bells, and all publick Demonstrations of Joy throughout London and Westminster.
