Copenhagen, May 12, N. S.

THE Margrave of Culmbach with his Princess arrived at Fredericksberg on the 9th Instant, and is to remove with the Court to Hirschholm, where Preparations are making to celebrate, more magnificently than usual, his Danish Majesty's Name-Day, which is on the 14th Instant. By Yesterday's Post from Hanover we learn, that the definitive Treaty concerning Steinhorst is now entirely agreed and concluded. M. Chavigny has notified to the Ministry, that the Marquis d'Antin, Vice-Admiral of France, proposes to set out towards the latter End of this Month with four Men of War for the Baltick, and desired that the Pilots upon the Coasts of his Danish Majesty's Territories may have Orders to assist and serve him. As no Council was held Yesterday, a Report of this has not yet been made to the King of Denmark; and To-morrow the Court removes to Hirschholm; so that all Affairs are suspended till Friday, which is to be the only Council Day every Week during Summer.

Dresden, May 12. His Polish Majesty has had no Return of his Fever since the 6th Instant; but does not as yet appear in publick. They begin here to think of the Electoral Prince's removing from Rome, and returning to Germany, after having seen the other Courts of Italy. The Great General of Poland has ordered all the Officers to repair to their Regiments.
