Petersbourg, April 24.

HIS Morning a Coufier arrived here from Kioff, with Advice, that the Grand Vizier had been depo-fed the 11th of March, and was fent in Exile to Chio. Two Couriers that are arrived on the Borders of Rullia from Conftantinople, report as certain, that the Perfian Ambaffadour who was going to the Porte died on the Road. It appears by that Amballadour's Papers, which were brought to Constantinople, that he had Orders to declare War to the Porte in cafe his Propofals were not accepted. The Seraskier of Widdin, who was expected at Constantinople about the 5th Instant, is named to succeed the late Grand Vizier. It is faid the new Grand Vizier will not be able to fet out from Con-ftantinople till the Month of May, there be-ing yet no Army allembled. The Want of Provisions increases at Constantinople.

Naples, April 28, N. S. We have Ad-vice, that on the 21st Instant a Maltele Man of War failed from Malta, conducting to Triefte 300 Sailors, and 14 Knights of that Order, which the Grand Mafter fends to Hungary for the Emperor's Service. The King, out of the Revenues of the Archbishoprick of Monreale, has referved to himfelf the Disposal of 12000 Ducats per Annum, which he has distributed as Gratifications to several Perfons, viz. 2000 to M. Reggio General of the Gallies, 2000 to M. de Montallegre Secretary of State, 6co to M. Brancone the King's private Secretary, 600 to his Majefly's Father Confession, and the rest to several Perfons in Sicily.

On the 10th Inftant the General Affembly of the Church of Scotland met here, and chose for their Moderator Mr. James Bannatine; his Majeffy's Commission to the Right Honourable the Earl of Hyndford was read, as was likewife his Majefty's most gracious I etter to the Affembly. His Majefly's High Committioner made a Speech to the Affembly, which was answered on their Part by the Moderator; and a Committee was ap-pointed to draw up a dutiful Answer to his Majesty's most gracious Letter; which being reported, was unanimoufly approved and prefented to the High Commissioner to be transmitted to his Majesty.
