Naples, June 9, N. S.

ON the 1st Instant the Constable Colonna and his Lady arrived here from Rome, and are lodged at the Duke of Maddalona's Palace: On the 2d his Excellency went to Court to pay his Duty to their Majesties, by whom he was graciously received, and this Day he was invested by the King with the Order of St. Gennaro. His Majesty has honoured the Constable Colonna's Lady and the Princess d'Avellino with the Title of Ladies of Honour to the Queen.

Vienna, June 20, N. S. The Body of Troops under the Command of Count Neuperg in the Bannat, consists of 19 Battallions, 18 Companies of Grenadiers, 49 Squadrons of Cuirassiers, 24 of Dragoons, and two Regiments of Hussars. The Body under the Command of Prince Lobkowitz in Transylvania, of 20 Battallions, 12 Companies of Grenadiers, 21 Squadrons of Cuirassiers, 28 of Dragoons, and two Regiments of Hussars. In the grand Army under the Command of Marshal Wallis, there are actually 47 Squadrons of Horse, and 35 of Dragoons; the actual Number of the Foot has not been specified in the last Letters, it being only mentioned, that as there is more Occasion for Infantry than for Cavalry in the designed Operations of this Campaign, the Foot of the Grand Army will be more numerous in Proportion than the Cavalry. 'Tis advised from Buda, that the six Frigates lately built and manned here, passed by that Place the 10th on their Way to Belgrade. The Eagle, which carried the Flag as Admiral, saluted the Fortrefs of Buda, by firing a certain Number of Guns, so did the other Frigates, and were answered from the Fortrefs Gun for Gun. The Elector of Bavaria having notified to the Emperour by a Gentleman sent Express his Arrival at Moelck, his Imperial Majesty has dispatched to him Count

Ferdinand de Lamberg to make his Compliments to their Electoral Highnesses, as also to the Duke and the three Princesses, on their Arrival in his Dominions. It is believed there will be an Interview in the Neighbourhood of Moelck between the Emperour and the Elector of Bavaria,

Lord James Casperdyff, Colonel Bland, and Colonel Onslow, many private Soldiers may have formerly deserted from them, and since enlisted themselves in other Regiments in Great Britain; and that divers Soldiers, who did formerly belong to the Regiments now in Great Britain, may have deserted from them, and entered themselves in some of the ten Regiments of Foot abovementioned: His Majesty is therefore graciously pleased hereby to grant his Pardon to all such Soldiers, who may have deserted in the Manner as aforesaid, before the first Day of this Instant if they inclusive, and who are now in any of the said ten Regiments, or in any of those in Great Britain; and likewise to declare, that it is his Royal Intention they shall continue in his Service, as they now are, without being molested or claimed by the Officers of the respective Corps to whom they did formerly belong.

THE King's Plate of One Hundred Guineas will be run for on Lewes Downs in Sussex, on Thursday the 16th of August next, by any Horse, Mare or Gelding, being no more than six Years old the Grass before, as must be certified under the Hand of the B eeder, carrying 12 Stone; three Heats round the Heats Course; to be shewn and entered at the Clerk's Office here in Lewes, on Wednesday the 15th of August next, on they are not to run for this Plate. And if any Difference arise relating to their Ages, entering or running, the same to be determined by his Grace the Duke of Newcastle, or whom he shall appoint; according to such his Majesty's Orders and Rules as shall be produced at the Place of entering or running for the said Plate. And on Friday the 17th of August next, a Plate of Twenty Guineas Value will be run for, by any Horse, Mare or Gelding, carrying Ten Stone, and not less than three Horses to run for the said Plate. And on Saturday the 18th of August next, a Plate of Fifty Guineas Value will be run for by any Horse, Mare or
