Yesterday being the Anniversary of his Majesty's Birth-day, the Great Guns were fired at the Barracks, and answered by Vollies from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out upon Oxinantown Green. Noon there was a vast Concourse of the Nobiliry and other Persons of Distinction of both Sexes, who appeared in great Splendor to compliment his Grace the Lord Licutenant, before whom an Ode fet to Mufick was performed. In the Evening a Play was given by his Grace to the Ladies. At Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy throughout the City; and at the Castle, the Ball and the several Entertainments were extremely regular and magnificent.
