Vienna, November 11, N. S.

THE Prince Hohenzollern, Prince Hilsbourghaufen, Prince Lobkowitz, and the Duke of Saxe-Weissenfels, will be soon declared Field-Marsbals; and Prince Charles of Lorraine, and the Generals Romer and Suckow will be appointed, as is said, Generals of the Artillery at the same Time. M. Jachtshiem set out on Monday Night, with Leave of the Court, to visit his Brother-in-Law General Neiperg.

Dresden, Nov. 11, N. S. The freshest Advices from Kaminieck of the 25th of October, seem to leave no Room to doubt of the Czarina's having ratified the Preliminaries, by the Account they give of the earnest Endeavours of the Russians to return over the Dniester, which is become by the great Land Floods very different from what it was when they went over it. The Increase and Violence of the Waters has carried away their three or four Bridges mentioned in our former Advices, and it is with great Labour, and Loss of many of their Men, and Poles whom they hire, that they get their Artillery and other heavy Things over on Floats. Count Wratislaw, the Emperor's Ambassador here, and the Queen of Poland's Lord Chamberlain, is set out for his Lands in Bohemia, in his Way to Vienna, where he is to pass some Time, having concerted Measures for the Discharge of the Saxon Auxiliaries quartered at present in the Berg Stadter District, where they will remain till their Commander Lieutenant-General Renard receives Advice from M. de Zeck, the Saxon Minister at Vienna, that the Equivalent agreed on in Lieu of their Winter Quarters is paid.

Dresden, Nov. 15, N. S. The Russians have entirely quitted Moldavia, and are marching towards Kioff in three Columns; but the Tartars in their Service having proved incapable of being kept in Bounds on their former Passage through Poland, notwithstanding the strict Discipline enjoined them by Count Munich, he has sent them round about by Soroka.

Whitehall, November 20.

His Excellency the Earl Waldegrave, His Majesty's Ambassador at Paris, having complained to the Court of France, that some Spanish Vessels had seized Ships belonging to His Majesty's Subjects in the River of Bourdeaux, the French Ministers have assured his Excellency, that Orders were sent to the proper Officers at that Place to endeavour to seize the Spaniards and their Vessels, and to restore immediately to His Majesty's Subjects the Ships and Effects that had been taken from them.
