FOUR of the Chiefs of the Family of Dolgorucky have lately been executed at Novogrod. It is said they were charged with having forged a Testament in the Name of the Czar Peter the Second, and with other Crimes of a fresher Date. The Troops are daily drawing from the Ukraine towards this Place; so that now there are about 30 or 40000 good Troops in the Neighbourhood. We have a Report here, that the famous Thamas Kouly Chan was lately killed in an Engagement with an Indian Nation called Bajaps, a bold and resolute People, inhabiting the Mountains between Indostan and Persia.

Stockholm, Dec. 7. M. Palmstierna is appointed to succeed M. Skutenhielm as Minister from this Court to that of Denmark.

Vienna, Dec. 12, N. S. The Bavarian Court has let up a Quarantine upon the Frontiers of Austria, by which it is ordered, that every Person coming from Vienna, who shall not have a proper Certificate of his having been Forty Days in that Town, shall, notwithstanding his Hungarian and other Quarantines, perform Forty Days Quarantine upon the Frontiers of Bavaria.

Hambourg, Dec. 15, N. S. Baron Dehn, whom the King of Denmark has appointed his Envoy Extraordinary to the Court of Spain, is soon expected here in his Way to Paris.

Vienna, Dec. 16, N. S. It is generally thought at Court, that nothing will be

finally resolved upon relating to the Imperial Military Establishments, till the Arrival after Christmas of Prince Hildburgshausen, who, for his Conduct in the last Campaign, is held in great Esteem as a General, by the Emperor.

Dresden, Dec. 27, N. S. Three Columns of the Russian Troops, that passed through Poland, are now supposed to be in their own Territories, as it is, that the fourth and last will soon overtake them. Most of the Artillery is to be left in Okop, and St. Trinity, two Forts belonging to the Republick, till the Roads are better, and more Horses can be had. It is reported here, that they had taken at Choczim and in Moldavia 800 Brass Cannon, most of them from 24 to 30 Pounders, besides some Iron Pieces.

Hague, Jan. 1, N. S. The Post from Friesland that came in to Day, has brought us the agreeable News of her Royal Highness the Princess of Orange's continuing to recover her Health and Strength as fast as can be expected.
