Moft of the Artillery is to be left in Okop, and St. Trinity, two Forts belonging to the Republick, till the Roads are better, and more Horfes can be had. It is reported here, that they had taken at Choczim and in Moldavia 800 Brass Cannon, most of them from 24 to 30 Pounders, befides fome Iron Pieces.
