THE Senate assembled three Days in the last Week, to consider whether it was necessary to call a Diet at this Juncture or not; and after Debate in three long Sessions, it was carried the 8th in the Negative. To-morrow Morning M. Palmstierna sets out from this Place for Ostrogothland: His Orders are to regulate his Stay there, so as to be at Copenhagen by To-morrow Fortnight at farthest.

Berlin, Dec. 29, N. S. His Prussian Majesty being recover'd of his late Indisposition, his Majesty was Yesterday at a great Entertainment which Lieutenant General Count Shullenburg gave to the Court of Wolfenbuttle: The Queen, and the rest of the Royal Family were also present.
