M. Egmond van der Nyenburgh, Envoy Extraordinary from the States General, is frequently in Conference with our Ministers of State; and it is rumour'd, that the Negotiation of a Treaty of Commerce between this Kingdom and the United Provinces of the Netherlands is so far advanced, that after the settling of a few Points of little Importance still remaining to be discuss'd, it will be shortly concluded. On the 3d Instant anchored in this Port from England three Merchant-men under the Convoy of His Britannick Majesty's Ship the Tyger, Captain Stanley, who with the rest of the Convoy were then in Sight of the Port.

Leghorn, Jan. 15. On the 13th Instant in the Evening anchor'd in this Port 24 British Merchant-men from Newfoundland, and other Parts, convoy'd by his Majesty's Ship the Rumney, Capt. Medley, Commander.

Venice, Jan. 16. On the 31st past the Prince Royal of Poland notified in Form to the Doge and Senate his Arrival here; and the Senate have elected four of their Nobles of the Families of Contarini, Mocenigo, Querini, and Correro, to compliment him on the Part of this Republick, to accompany him during his Stay here, and to see that his Highness be shewn all the Rarities of this City, and entertain'd with all the Diversions usual at this Season. Signor Gio. Priuli, Procurator of St. Mark, being dead, his Excellency Sig. Nicolo Venier was by the Election of the Great Council promoted some Days ago to that high Office; on which Occasion his Palace was for three Nights successively illuminated within and without, and Bonfires made before it. The largest Apartments were frequented every Night by a great Number of Masques, who were served with the choicest Refreshments. Victuals and Wine were distributed plentifully to the common

People in the Streets, and a good Sum of Money thrown among them. The Prince Royal of Poland appearing there, was presented with a Purse of Gold and Silver Coin, which he threw among the Populace. It is said his Highness will shortly set out for Vienna. Sig. Simone Contarini, late Ambassador of this Republick at Constantinople, arrived in our Port a few Days ago, and immediately went into the old Lazaretto to perform Quarantain.

Vienna, Jan. 20. The Venetians having begun to reduce their Quarantain from forty two Days to twenty eight, and there being Ground to believe they will still reduce it to a shorter Time, it is said the Duke of Lorraine Great Duke of Tuscany, will take a Journey this Winter to Florence. The greatest Part of the Regiment of Caraffa which served the last Campaign in the Army in Hungary is arrived here, after performing Quarantain at Mannerstorff; a Regiment of Horse is arrived at that Place, and after 15 Days Quarantain, is to remove from thence to make Room for another Regiment. All the Officers and Passengers which come from Hungary report, that the contagious Distemper has almost ceased there; and it being hoped that the present Rigour of the Weather will entirely deliver the Kingdom from that Calamity, the College of Health have taken a Resolution to send Commissaries thither, with Orders to go through all the Places that have been infected, and to transmit an Account of the Condition in which they shall find them. The Prince of Saxe Hildbourghausen has ordered the best Apartments of his Palace here to be made ready with magnificent Furniture for the Reception of the Prince Royal of Poland Electoral Prince of Saxony, who is expected from Venice. It is rumour'd that Field-Marshal Count Harrach designs to lay down his Office of President of the Council of War, and that it will be conferr'd on the Prince of Saxe Hildbourghausen. Our Nobility

ity have in their Assemblies made Collections towards the Relief of the poor Inhabitants of this Capital, who suffer extremly by the Continuance of the cold Weather; and have put the Money into the Hands of the Civil Officers of the Suburbs, who have bought up and distributed to the Needy great Quantities of Wood for Firing. The Court has likewise bestowed large Sums in Charity upon this Occasion.
