Dresden, January 31. We are informed that M. Wisniakow, the Russian Counsel-We are inform'd who was charged with the Czarina's Ratification of the Peace, is on his Return with that of the Grand Signior. He passed by Chockzim, in order to authorize the Commander of the Russian Troops to deliver that Fortress to the Turks; which was accordingly done the 4th Instant, with 30 Pieces of Ordnance, and the Fortifications entire. That Garrison, the only remaining Detatchment of the Russian Army, is actually on the March thro' Poland.
