*Dresden, January 31.* We are inform'd that M. Wiśniakow, the Russian Counsellor, who was charged with the Czarina's Ratification of the Peace, is on his Return with that of the Grand Signior. He passed by Chockzim, in order to authorize the Commander of the Russian Troops to deliver that Fortrefs to the Turks; which was accordingly done the 4th Instant, with 30 Pieces of Ordnance, and the Fortifications entire. That Garrison, the only remaining Detachment of the Russian Army, is actually on the March thro' Poland. The Prince of Hesse Hombourg went from hence the 28th Instant, highly satisfied with the Honours and Presents, which both he and the Princess his Consort received from their Polish Majesties. His was the King's Picture set with Diamonds, and hers, from the Queen of Poland, was a Diamond Ring, with some Fire-Arms, her Highness shewing great Delight and Skill in Shooting. His Highness is gone by Berlin, being invited last Summer by his Prussian Majesty to pass that Way on his Return to Petersbourg.

*Berlin, February 2.* On Saturday, Sunday and Yesterday his Prussian Majesty complained that the Oppression on his Breast was increased; but to Day he is much easier, and even so well, that his Majesty dined with
