Rome, February 13.

**O**N the 6th Instant in the Evening, Cardinal Hannibal Albani, Camarlingo, held a Congregation at his Palace, in which he committed to the Clerks of the late Pope's Chamber, during the Vacancy of the Holy See, the Care of the Apartments of the Quirinal and Vatican Palaces. On the 7th, Cardinal Lawrence Altieri, first Dean, conferred at his Palace with the Cardinals Hannibal Albani, Ottoboni, and Alberoni, and settled every Thing that may relate to the Publick Security and Quiet during the Vacancy of the Holy See; and the Chiefs of the Tribunals being summon'd before them, they gave the necessary Instructions to them. In the Evening the Pope's Corpse was transported with the usual publick Formality from the Quirinal to the Chapel of St. Sixtus in the Vatican. On the 8th a general Congregation assembled at the Vatican, when the Bulls of the former Popes, for the Direction of the Conclave and the Election of a new Pope were read, on which Occasion the Cardinals took their Oaths, and the Governor of Rome and other Ministers were confirm'd in their respective Posts. The same Day Cardinal Lamberg arrived Here from Germany. On the 10th, a Corsair of Barbary having been driven on Shore by Distress of Weather at Fiumicino on the Roman Coast, many of the Crew perish'd, and about 40 were seized by the Country People.

*Dresden, March 6.* M. Ehrencrone, the Swedish Minister at Warsaw, being named to be Judge of a Province in Sweden, vacant by the Death of young Count Bonde, M. Wolfenstierne, now at this Court without a Character, is to remain here and expect Letters of Credence from Sweden. The King of Poland's second Daughter the Prin-

cess Mary Anne, now in the 12th Year of her Age, is taken ill of the Small Pox, but from the Mildness of the Sort there is no Danger apprehended.
