Stapleton, which he had fent to craize off Cartagena, and which had taken two Vellels, with Supplies of Ammunition, Stores and Provisions that were going to Cartagena. On the 7th in the Evening Capt. Stapleton having taken in Water, was fent by the Admiral to cruize on his former

During the Admiral's Stay at Porto Bello, he fent a Letter to the President of Panama, demanding the Releasement of the Factors and Servants of the South Sea Company, who were confined at that Place; in Consequence of which, the President of Panama sent an Officer with Mr. Humphreys and Dr. Wright, Factors, and also with the Servants of the South Sea Company, who were delivered to the Admiral at Porto Bel-

The Governor and Inhabitants of Porto Bello, expressed the greatest Sense of the Humanity and Generofity, with which they were treated by the Admiral, and his Majesty's Squadron under his Command.

On the 13th of December, Vice-Admiral Vernon, with his Squadron, sailed from Porto Bello for Jamaica; and being off Cartagena, on the 28th of December, sent away Captain Rentone in the Spanish Snow, for England.
