*Naples, October 18, N. S.*

**T**HE King has made a Present to M. Peyrard, the French Physician who attended at the Queen's Delivery, of a Gold-Hilted Sword, a Watch, a Ring, a Gold Snuff-box set with Jewels, and 1000 Spanish Dubloons in Money, the whole valued at about 30000 Ducats. On the 12th Instant the Ships of War St. Philip and Parthenope were ordered to be laid up for the Winter, their Voyage for Constantinople being put off till next Spring. A Train of large Brass Cannon for Battery has been newly cast here, out of old Cannon brought hither from several Fortresses of this Kingdom. On the 15th the King and Queen, attended by the Court in rich Habits, went with the usual publick Formality to the Cathedral Church, for the first Time since the Queen's lying-in. And on her Return to Court she was complimented by the Foreign Ministers, General Officers, Nobility, and the Magistrates of this City in a Body; and in the Evening by the Ladies. On which Occasion the Guns of the Castles were fired, and Illuminations made throughout the City. On the 16th their Majesties, with the young Princess, set out for Portici, where they propose to pass some Weeks. A small Train of Cannon and Mortars are sent thither, for the Camp which is form'd in that Neighbourhood for their Majesties Diversion. The King has conferred the Order of Knighthood of Saint Januarius, on the Marquess of Campo-Florido, a Native of Sicily, Ambassadour from Spain at the Court of France.

*Vienna, Oct. 29, N. S.* On the 26th the Queen our Sovereign left the Palace of Favorita, where the late Emperor died, and came to the Palace here. Her Majesty has sent to the States of this Province a Royal Decree, acquainting them with the Death of the Emperor, her taking Possession of the Regency of all his Hereditary Territories, and appointing them to repair hither and pay Homage to her on the 22d of next Month. Her Majesty has likewise notified to the States of Hungary the Emperor's Decease, and her Accession to the Throne of that Kingdom; and ordered them to assemble in Dyet at Presbourg towards the End of this Year, in order to the settling of the Time of her Coronation. The Nobility of that Kingdom

have expressed great Joy, on the late Promotion of Count Palfi to the Dignity of Palatine of Hungary. That Palatine is not yet gone from hence, but has frequent Conferences with Count Gundaker Stahrenberg, who is much in the Queen's Trust.

*Dublin, October 31.*

Yesterday being His Majesty's Birth-day, the great Guns were fired at the Barracks, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out upon Oxmantown Green: At Noon there was a numerous Appearance of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction at the Castle, to compliment their Excellencies the Lords Justices upon this Occasion, before whom a Song was performed. In the Evening there was a Play given by their Excellencies for the Entertainment of the Ladies; and the Night concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy.
