THE Consuls of the different Trades of this City, have by Direction of the Court laid a Tax on the respective Companies towards the Expences of the publick Rejoycings for the Birth of the young Princes. On the 20th, 21st and 22d Instant their Majesties attended by the Ministers and many of the Nobility were to see the Encampment at Granatello on the Sea Coast near Portici, consisting of Pickets of the several Regiments of Foot, in all about 1500 Men, commanded by the General Officers, where they saw an Attack made in Form, and the taking of a wooden Fort, purposely built there for the Diversion of the Court

Petersbourg, Oct. 21. The young Sovereign was removed the 19th Instant from the Summer Palace where her late Majesty died, to the Winter Palace: He was carried in a Chair in his Nurse's Lap, attended by a Detachment of the Horse Guards, the Grand Marshal, the other Great Officers of the Court, and the Chambellans walking on Foot; the Princess Ann his Mother followed immediately after in a Coach, to which the Duke Regent led her. His Highness the Regent, with the Courland Family, will remain some Days longer at the Summer Palace. The Mourning is not yet fixed, nor will the Funeral be performed these six Weeks. The Form of Prayer in the Churches is now, for his Majesty, his Parents the Princess Ann and the Prince of Brunswick, the Princess Elizabeth, and the Duke Regent.

Copenhagen, Nov. 5. The Apprehensions here of a general Scarcity have induced the Court to take what Measures they can to prevent it. The Prohibition to export Corn from Holstein and those Parts, which was suspended by a Placard of the 17th of September last, is again renewed, so that no sort of Grain is now to be carried out of any Part of his Danish Majesty's Dominions.

Whitehall, November 15.

Yesterday Capt. Burdett, of his Majesty's Ship the Blandford, arrived at Spithead from Jamaica, and brought an Account of his having met on the 4th of September last, 12 Leagues to the West of Cape Tiberon on the Island of Hispaniola, 10 Sail of Ships, which he took to be his Majesty's Ships the Defiance and Tilbury, with the Ships under their Convoy; and Capt. Douglas, of his Majesty's Ship the Falmouth, who joined him on the 9th of September, confirmed the same, he having spoke with them. In all Probability they got into Jamaica the next Day.
