N the 21st Instant came in his Britannick Majesty's Ship the Prince of Orange, having lost her Main-mast and Mizen-mast in a Storm of Wind on the First of November O.S. in the Latitude of 48; and the 23d came in the Superbe, having lost all her Masts in the same Storm; the Cumberland accompanied her to see her safe into Harbour: The latter will soon put to Sea again to follow the Fleet under Sir Chaloner Ogle. The Commanders of these Men of War are of Opinion, that the rest of the Ships received no Damage that might prevent their proceeding on, and judge they have had a fair Wind ever since

Naples, Nov. 8, N. S. Last Week the Ratification of the Treaty of Commerce and Navigation between the King and the Porte, lately exchanged at Constantinople, was, by Order of the Court, published with the usual Formality throughout this Capital, Abruzzo, Apuglia, and other Provinces of this Kingdom. On the 3d Instant their Majestics arrived in Town from Portici, to be present on the 4rh at the Festival of St Charles, (the Name of the King) on which Occasion the Foreign Ministers, General Officers, Nobility, and the City in a Body, were to compliment their Majesties, who on the 5th returned to Portici. The Magistrates of Health here, in Imitation of those of Venice, have forbidden all Commerce with Hungary,

Transilvania, &c. without performing 40 Days Quarantain. They have also assigned seven Days Quarantain to all Vessels from the Coasts of Genoa and Tuscany.

Berlin, Nov. 24, N. S. Last Week Orders were given for twenty Battallions of Foot, and twenty six Squadrons of Horse, making together about twenty thousand Men, to hold themselves in Readiness to march. Since which, Orders have been given for one Squadron of the Gens d'Arms to be ready also to march. These Forces are to be commanded in Chief by Felt Marshal Schwerin, and under him by the Lieutenant Generals Prince Leopold and Count Schullenburg, and by the Majors General La Mothe, Klerst, Prince Henry, Gotz, and Dershaw. This Body of Troops is to be accompanied by a Train of Artillery consisting of 20 Cannon three Pounders, four twelve Pounders, eight Mortar Pieces, with a proper Number of Gunners and Bombardiers, commanded by a Major, a Captain, and four Lieutenants.

Barlin, Nov. 26. All the Horses for the Service of the Artillery are arrived, to the Number of sixteen Hundred, and the Train is taken out of the Arsenal, before which it is now drawn up, and ready to move at a Minute's Warning; as are also all the Regiments Horse and Foot, which had received Orders to prepare themselves for a March.
