Berlin, December 31.

According to our Accounts from Silesia, the Prussian Army advances but slowly, they finding, through the Badness of the Roads and of the Season, more Difficulties than they expected. They have left Glogow behind them, after having posted some Troops near it, which are commanded by the Duke of Holstein. His Prussian Majesty, with the Rest of the Army, is marched farther up into the Country; and on the 26th, when the last Letters came away, he was got to Beerdorf, in the Dutchy of Lignitz. There are 53 large Boats in the River here, ready laden with Corn, Cannon, and Ammunition for the Army in Silesia, but they cannot move yet, the River being frozen. Amongst the Cannon there are 20 Battering Pieces of 24 Pounders. M. Bulow, the Saxon Minister, not being yet come back from the Prussian Army, it is supposed he is gone to Dresden.

Berlin, Jan. 7. There are Letters from the Prussian Army of the 2d and 3d Instant, which bring certain Advice that his Prussian Majesty was got to Breslau, and that he had taken the Dohm, which is a small Fort in the Suburbs, where there used to be a few Companies of Imperial Troops. These Letters add, that it was said his Prussian Majesty intended to proceed as far as Jablunka, which lies near the Frontiers of Hungary, and that he will assemble there such a Number of Forces, as may dispute the Passage of the Troops which have Orders to march from that Kingdom into Silesia. M. Brackel, the Muscovite Minister here, has received Orders to make the strongest Representations against the Measures his Prussian Majesty is pursuing, and to let this Court know, that that of Pe-

tersbourg is firmly resolved punctually to execute all their Engagements with that of Vienna.

Copenhagen, Jan. 3. The King of Denmark being perfectly recovered of his late Indisposition, Count Fink, the Prussian Minister Plenipotentiary, had Yesterday his first Audience of his Danish Majesty. The Queen does not yet stir out of her Apartments.
