## Berlin, December 31.

Ccording to our Accounts from Silesia, the Prussian Army advances but flowly, they finding, through the Badnels of the Roads and of the Seafon, more Difficulties than they expect-ed. They have left Glogow behind them, after having posted some Troops near it, which are commanded by the Duke of Holftein. His Pruffian Majesty, with the Reft of the Army, is marched farther up into the Country; and on the zoth, when the laft Letters came away, he was got to Beerf-dorf, in the Dutchy of Lignitz. There are is large Boats in the River here, ready laden with Corn, Cannon, and Ammunition for the Army in Silefia, but they cannot move yet, the River being frozen. Amongst the Cannon there are 20 Battering Pieces of 24 Pounders. M. Bulow, the Saxon Minister, not being yet come back from the Pruffian

Army, it is supposed he is gone to Dresden. Berlin, Jan. 7. There are Letters from the Prussian Army of the 2d and 3d Instant, which bring certain Advice that his Prussian Majesty was got to Breslau, and that he had taken the Dohm, which is a finall Fort in the Suburbs, where there used to be a few Companies of Imperial Troops. These Letters add, that it was faid his Pruffian Majefty intended to proceed as far as Jablunka, which lies near the Frontiers of Hungary, and that he will affemble there fuch a Number of Forces, as may difpute the Paffage of the Troops which have Orders to march from that Kingdom into Silefia. M. Brackel, the Muscovite Minister here, has received Orders to make the ftrongeft Representations against the Meafures his Pruffian Majefty is purfuing, and to let this Court know, that that of Petersbourg is firmly refolved punctually to execute all their Engagements with that of Vienna.

Copenhagen, Jan. 3. The King of Den-mark being perfectly recovered of his late In-difpolition, Count Fink, the Pruffian Mini-fter Plenipotentiary, had Yefterday his firft Audience of his Danifh Majeity. The Queen does not yet flir out of her Apartments.
