Berlin, January 14.

Ccording to Letters from Breflau of the 7th, his Prussian Majesty had left that Place to go towards Olau and Klein-Olfe, from whence Orders were to be given to block up Brieg, as has been done with Glogow, and the Re-mainder of the Army was to march to the River Neifs, where 'twas faid they are to quarter themselves, and wait till the Seafon and Weather will permit them to go upon

new Enterprizes. Berlin, Jan. 17. Since the Advices of his Prufian Majefty's having left Breflau, Ac-counts are come of his having arrived at Olau; that Felt-Marshal Schwerin was got to Ottmachaw; and that the Prussian Troops had taken Possession of both these Places, and made the Garrifons Prifoners.

Berlin, Jan. 21. A Confirmation is arri-ved here of the taking of Ottmachaw by the Pruffians : It is a finall Caftle fituate near the River Neifs. The Garrifon, confifting of five incompleat Companies of Grenadiers, in all about 250 Men, were made Prisoners after a Refiftance of 24 Hours. In this Affair the Pruffians had a Major of Engineers and 12 private Men killed, according to fome Letters; but others make the Lofs amount to 50 Men. There has likewife been a Skirmish between the Pruffian Huffars and Prince Lichtenstein's Regiment of Dragoons near Ottmachaw, in which the former were drawn into an Am-buscade; the Lieutenant who commanded them, and feveral Huflars, were cut to Pieces. After the Action, the Austrian Dragoons feeing a superior B dy were advancing towards them, retired to the other Side of the Neiß. At Olau there were 150 Men, but they furrendred the Place on Condition that they fhould be conducted to Brieg, which was done accordingly. When Felt - Marshal Schwerin fummoned Ottmachaw to furrender, his Aide de Camp, who was charged with that Commission, having advanced too near the Place before he beat a Parley, the Garrifon fired upon him and killed his Drummer, the Aide de Camp himfelf having a narrow Ef-cape, his Horfe having been fhot under him. On Thurfday laft Orders came to Major General Count Trouchles's Regiment, quartered in this Town, to march forthwith towards Silefia, and accordingly they are to fet out To-morrow. It is fuppofed other Regiments have received the like Orders; all Advices

agreeing, that the Body of Austrian Troops on the other Side the River Neifs grows daily more confiderable by the Arrival of Regi-ments from Hungary, Moravia, and Bohemia.
