IS Majesty came this Day to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes, feated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, SirCharles Dalton, Gentleman-Uther of the Black Rod, was sent with a Message from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers; the Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Afsent to,

An Ast to supply some Defects in the Laws for repairing and rebuilding County Bridges; for repairing, enlarging, erecting, and providing Houfes of Correction, and for passing Rogues and Vagabonds.

An AST to continue an AST for Relief of Debtors, with respect to the Imprisonment of their Persons, and two subsequent ASTs for explaining and amending the same 3 and also to continue an AST for the free Importation of Cochined and Indico.

An Aft for continuing an Aft paffed in the Seventh Year of the Reign of his prefent Majefty, to explain and amend a former Aft paffed in the Eleventh Year of the Reign of his late Majefty King George the First, for the better regulating the Manufasture of Cloth, in the West Riding of the County of York, and for making the faid Afts more effectual. And to Seven private Bills.

His Majesty was afterwards pleased to make the following most gracious Speech from the Throne to both Houses of Parliament.

My Lords and Gentlemen, A T the opening of this Seffion I took Notice to you of the Death of the late Emperor, and of my Refolution to adhere to the Engagements I am under, in order to the maintaining of the Balance of Power, and the Liberties of Europe, on that important Occafion. The Aflurances I received from you in Return to this Communication, were perfectly agreeable to that Zeal and Vigour, which this Parliament has always exerted in

the Support of the Honour and Interest of my Crown and Kingdoms, and of the common Cause.

The War, which has fince broke out, and been carried on in Part of the Auftrian Dominions, and the various and extensive Claims, which are publickly made on the late Emperor's Succession, are new Events, that re-quire the utmost Care and Attention; as they may involve all Europe in a bloody War, and in Confequence expose the Dominions of fuch Princes, as shall take Part in Support of the Pragmatick Sanction, to imminent and immediate Danger. The Queen of Hungary has already made a Requilition of the Twelve thousand Men expressly stipulated by Treaty; and thereupon I have demanded of the King of Denmark, and of the King of Sweden, as Landgrave of Helle Caffel, their respective Bodies of Troops, confisting of Six thousand Men each, to be in Readiness to march forthwith to the Affiftance of her Hungarian Majesty. I am also concerting luch further Measures, as may obviate and difappoint all dangerous Defigns and Attempts that may be forming or carried on in Favour of any unjust Pretentions, to the Prejudice of the Houle of Austria. In this complicated and uncertain State of Things many Incidents may arife, during the Time, when, by Reason of the approaching Conclusion of this Parliament, it may be impoffible for me to have your Advice and Affiltance; which may make it neceffary for me to enter into ftill larger Expences for maintaining the Pragmatick Sanction. In a Conjuncture fo critical, I have thought it proper to lay these impor-tant Confiderations before you, and to defire the Concurrence of my Parliament, in enabling me to contribute, in the most effectual Manner, to the Support of the Queen of Hungary, the preventing, by all reafonable Means, the Subverfion of the Houle of Auftria, and to the maintaining the Liberties and Balance of Power in Europe

Gentlemen of the House of Commons,

fectly agreeable to that Zeal and Vigour, I must recommend it to you to grant me which this Parliament has always exerted in fuch a Supply, as may be requisite for these Ends;



Ends; and the Just Concern and Readiness which I have constantly found in you, to make all necellary Provisions for the publick Good and our common Security leave me no Room to doubt of the fame good Difpolition" and Affection in this Inftance.

My Lords and Gentlemen,

I am perfusded, I need fay no more to recommend these Confiderations to you, which To necellarily arife from the prefent Situation of Affairs. I shall therefore only add, that whatever Expences may be incurred on this Occafion, shall be made in as frugal a Manner as possible ; and an Account thereof shall be laid before the next Parliament.
