Dmiral Gordon, after a lingring Illnefs, died at Cronftadt the 18th Instant. The Pruffian Commander in that Place being fummoned, he and his Garrilon, conlifting of 900 Men, yielded themfelves Prifoners of War, and were conducted to Neifs.

Berlin, April 18. Since the 15th Inftant, a third Officer is arrived here Express from the Pruffian Army in Silefia : The Particulars he brought of the Battle fought at Molwitz on the roth Inftant, are the lame as those that were received by the former. Colonel Count Finch is dead of his Wounds, Colonel Hautcharmois, of Colonel Kleift's Regiment, not mentioned in the former Lift, is among the Dead; as alfo a great Number of Captains and Subaltern Officers. The Heat of the Action was at the Pruffians Right Wing, and all the Regiments of Horfe and Foot posted there, suffered much.
