Admiral Gordon, after a lingering Illness, died at Cronstadt the 18th Instant. Felt Marshal Count Munnich is about to remove from the House he lived in just by the Court whilst he was Prime Minister, to his own on the other Side of the River. Lieutenant-General Spiegel, who had Leave to go to Germany on his private Affairs in May last, returned hither three or four Days ago.

Vienna, April 12, N. S. The freshest Advices that we have received from the Army in Silesia commanded by Field-Marshal Count Neiperg, are dated the 9th Instant, and relate, that on the 8th the Field-Marshal detached General Berlinchen with some Troops, which invested Grotkau. The Prussian Commander in that Place being summoned, he and his Garrison, consisting of 900 Men, yielded themselves Prisoners of War, and were conducted to Neiss.

Berlin, April 18. Since the 15th Instant, a third Officer is arrived here Express from the Prussian Army in Silesia: The Particulars he brought of the Battle fought at Molwitz on the 10th Instant, are the same as those that were received by the former. Colonel Count Finch is dead of his Wounds, Colonel Hautcharmois, of Colonel Kleist's Regiment, not mentioned in the former List, is among the Dead; as also a great Number of Captains and Subaltern Officers. The Heat of the Action was at the Prussians Right Wing, and all the Regiments of Horse and Foot posted there, suffered much.
