Appointing the Distribution of Prives taken by Way of Reprizal before his Majesty's Declaration of War.

and taken feveral Ships, Veffels and Goods belonging to the King of Spain, or his Sub-Jets, or others inhabiling within the Territories of the King of Spain, the Property whereof became verted in his M jufty. We having taken the fame into Confideration, together with the great Loffes his Majefty's Subjects have fuffained by the repeated Depredations of the Spaniards for many Years paft, for which they have hitherto received no keparation or Satisfaction: And having likewife confidered the good and faithful Services of his Majerty's Officers and Seamen, in feizing and taking the fud Spanish Ships and Effects, do, by and with the Advice of his Majefty's Privy Council, hereby publish and declare, That the neat Produce ariling from the Sale or Disposal of all the faid Ships, Veslels and Goods which have been fo fe zed and taken; and which have been or thall be condemned, thall be divided into two Moieties or equal 1 arts, one Molety whereof to be paid to and amongft luch of his Maj: fty's Subjects as have fuffered by the unjust Seizures and Depredations of the Spariards, and to be difficiented in fuch Manner and Proputions, and under fuch Regulations as his Majetty shall hereafter be pleafed to direct and appoint ; and the other fame Manner and Proportions as is directed One thouland feven hundred and forty, for nemy, in Pusfuance of an AA of Parliament Reign, intitled, An Act for the more effectual fecuring and encouraging the Trade of his Majefty's Britilh Subje to to America, and for the Encouragement of Seamen to enter into his Mijesty's Service. And to the End that his Majesty's most gracious Intentions towards the faid Officers and Sailors may be effectually carried into Execution, we do hereby thri Hy enjoin all and every Commander and Commanders of his Majefty's Ships of War who have taken any Prize as aforelaid, as foon as may be, to transmit or caufe to be tranl-

transmitted to the Commissioners of his Majes ty's Navy a true Hill of the Names of all the Officers and Seamen who were actually on board his Majefty's Ships of War under his or their Commandat the taking fuch Prize; which Lift shall contain the Number of each Person as he stands upon the Ship's Book, and the Quality of his Service ; and the fame shall be fubscribed by the Captain or commanding Officer and three or more of the chief Officers on board. And we do hereby require and direct the Commissioners of his Majesty's Navy, or any three or more of them, after Condemnation of fuch Prize, to examine or caufe to be examined, fuch Lift by the Mufter-Book of fuch Ships of War, to fee that fuch Lift doth agree with the faid Mufter-Book, as to the Names, Qualities or Ratings of the Officers and Seamen belonging to fuch Ships of War ; and upon Request, forthwith to grant a Certificate of the Truth of any Lift transmitted to them, to the Agents to be nominated and appointed by the Captors to take care or difpole of fuch Prize, or the Produce thereof : And allo upon Application made to them, to give or caule to be given unto the Agents who shall at any Time or Times be appointed as aforefaid by the Captors of fuch Prizes taken by any of his Majefty's Ships of War, Copies of all fuch Lifts from the Muster-Book of any fuch Ships of War as the faid Agents shall find requilite for their Direction in paying the Produce of fuch Prizes, and to be otherwife aiding and affifting to the faid Agents as shall be necessary. And, we do hereby further declare and direct, That publick Notification shall be given by the Persons or Agents fo appointed of the Day appointed for the Payipent of the feveral Shares to the Captors; after which publick 'Notification; if any Mens Shares shall remain in the Hands of the Perfons or Agents appointed as aforefaid, and thall not be legally demanded within three Years, then fuch Share or Shares to remaining in fuch Persons or Agents Hands, shall go to and be paid to the Ule of Greenwich Hospital.e And to the End that all Perfons who are or shall be entitled to any such Share or Shares may have due Notice of the Time of Payment thereof, lo as to make their Claims Intercunto in due Time, we do hereby require, that the Perfons or Agents which shall be ap-· pointed to make fuch Sales, shall give Notice of the Day and Place which shall be by them appointed for Payment of the feveral Shares to the Captors in the London Gazette. And -coffbe End that the Governors of Greenwich Hulpital may know who are the Perlons or tAgents employed to receive and pay the feveral Shares of fuch Perfons as were on board the Ship or Ships at the Time of taking any Prize, to as to demand the Shares of fuch of sche Captors who shall not legally make their Demand within three Years, We do hereby -direct that a true Lift of the Names of fuch e Ferfors as that he fo appointed Agents for the Purpoles atogetaid, thall be for thy with cerrified sto the Governor or Deputy-Governor for the

A DECLARATION, Appointing the Distribution of Prizes taken fince the Dectaration of War, and before the Commencement of the Ast of Parliament for granting the Prizes to the Captors.

WHereas by an Act of Parliament made in the Thirteenth Year, of his Majefty's Reign, entituled, An Act for the more effectual fecuring and encouraging the Trade of his Majefty's British Subject to America, and for the Encouragement of Seamen to enter into his Majefty's Service, it is amongst other Things enacted; That the Flag Officers, Commanders, and other Officers, Seamen, Marines and Soldiers on board every Ship and Veffel of War in his Mijefty's Pay, fhall have the fole Intereft and Property of and in all and every Ship, Veffel, Goods and Merchandize which they fhall take after the fourth Day of January, in the Year of our Lord One thouland seven hundred and thirty-nine in Europe, and after the twenty-fourth Day of June, in the Year of our Lord One thousand feven hundled and forty in any other Part of the World, (being first adjudged lawful Prize in any of his Majelty's Courts of Admiralty in Great Britain or in his Plantations in America, or elfewhere) to be divided in fuch Proportions and after fuch Manner as his Majesty, his Heirs and Succeffors shall think fit to order and direct by Proclamation to be iffued for that Purpole. Ιń Pursuance whereof, a Proclamation was islued on the nineteenth of June One thousand feven hundred and forty, directing in what Manner and Proportion the faid Prizes fhould be diffributed among the Captors. And whereas between the Time of his Majesty's Declaration of War against Spain, which was on the nineteenth of October One thousand seven hundred and thirty-nine, and the aforementioned Fourth of January, One thousand seven hundred and thirty nine, his Majesty's Ships of War have feized and taken in Europe feveral Ships, Vellels and Goods belonging to the Enemy; and between the faid nineteenth of October One thoufand feven hundred and thirty-nine and the faid twenty-fourth of June One thousand seven hundred and forty, his Majesty's Ships of War have taken divers other Ships, Vessels and Goods of the Enemy in other Parts of the World, the Property whereof became vefted in his Majefty; We having taken the fame into Confideration, together with the good and faithful Service of "Time being of the faid Holpital, by his his Majefty's Officers and Sailors who were concerned

cerned in feizing and, taking the faid Ships and Goods; and being inclined to give all due Encouragement to fuch their Fidelity and Valour, do, by the Advice of his Majefty's Privy Council, hereby publish and declare, that the neat Produce arifing from the Sale or Difpofal of all Ships, Veffels and Goods taken from the Enemy by his Majefty's Ships of War, between the Time of his Majefty's faid Declaration of War, and the Times specified in the faid Act of Parliament, which have been or fhall be condemned and adjudged as lawful Prize in any of the Courts of Admiralty within his Majesty's Dominions, be paid to and amongst the Officers and Sailors of his Majefty's Ships of War, who were con-cerned in the Scizing and Taking the faid Ships, Veflels and Goods from the Enemy, and to be diffributed and divided amongst them, in the fame Manner and Proportions as is directed by the aforementioned Pioclamation of the Nineteenth of June, One thoufand feven hun-And we do hereby ftricily dred and forty. enjoyn all and every Commander and Commanders of his Majefty's Ships of War who have taken any Prize as a orefaid, as foon as may be, to transmit or cause to be transmitted to the Commitlioners of his Majefty's Navy, a true Lift of the Names of all the Officers and Seamon who were actually on board his Majefty's Ships of War under his or their Command at the taking fuch Prize: Which Lift fhall contain the Number of each Person, as he stands upon the Ship's Book, and the Quality of his Service; and the fame fhall be fubicribed by the Captain or Commanding Officer, and three or more of the Chief Officers on boatd: And we do hereby require and direct the Committi ners of his Majeity's Navy, or any three or more of them, after Condemnation of fuch Prize, to ex mine or caufe to be examined, fuch Lift by the Mufter-Book of fuch Ships of War, to fee that such Lift doth agree with the faid Muster-Book as to the Names, Qualities or Ratings of the Officers' and Seamen belonging to fuch Ships of War, and upon Req .eft forthwith to grant a Certificate of the Truth of any Lift transmitted to them to the Agents to be nominated and appointed by the Captors to take care or dispose of such Prize, or the Produce thereof : And alfo upon Application made to them, to give or caufe to be given unto the Agents who Ihall at apy Time or Times be appointed as aforefaid by the Captors of fuch Prizes taken by any of his Majethy's Ships of War, Copies of all fuch Lifts from the Muster Book of any fuch Ships of War as the faid Agents shall find requisite for their Direction in paying the Produce of fuch Prizes, and to be otherwife aid, ing and affifting to the faid Agents as fhall be neceflary. And we do hereby further declare and direct, that publick Notification shall be given by the Perfons or Agents fo appointed, of the Day appointed for the Payment of the feveral Shares to the Captors, after which publick Notification, if any Mens Shares shall remain in the Hands of the Perfons or Agents appointed as aforefaid, and fhall not be legally demanded within three Years, then fuch Share or Shares fo remaining in fuch Perfons or Agents

Hands, fhall go to and be paid to the Use of Greenwich Hospital. And to the End that all Perfons who are or fhall be entitled to any fuch Share or Shares may have due Notice of the Time of Payment thereof, fo as to make their Claims thereunto in due Time, we do hereby require, that the Perfons or Agents which shall be appointed to make fuch Sales, fhall give Notice of the Day and Place which shall be by them appointed for Payment of the feveral Shares to the Captors in the London Gazette. And to the End that the Governors of Greenwich Hofpital may know who are the Perfons or Agents employed to receive and pay the feveral Shares of fuch Perfons as were on board the Ship or Ships at the Time of taking any Prize, to as to demand the Shares of fuch of the Captors who fhall not legally make their Demand within three Years, we do hereby direct, that a true Lift of the Names of fuch Perfons as shall be fo appointed Agents for the Purpoles alorefaid, fhall be forthwith certified to the Governor or Deputy-Governor for the Time being of the faid Hofpital, by his Majefty's High Court of Admiralty, which is hereby required to take an Account of the Names of fuch Perfons as are or fhall be appointed Agents by the Captors.

# Whitehall, June 19.

Captain Wimbleton, Commander of his Majesty's Sloop the Cruizer, arrived here Yes terday in the Evening, from Portsmouth, having been dispatched from the Harbour of Cartagena the 26th of April, with Letters for his Grace the Duke of Newcastle his Ma jesty's Principal Secretary of State, from Vice-Admiral Vernon, and from Brigadier General Wentworth, giving the following Account.

On the 1st of April in the Evening, the Sailors, by the Admiral's Direction, made a Channel through the Enemies funk Wrecks, by which the Bomb-ketches were got in, and two Frigates to cover them, commanded by Capt. Rentone and Capt. Roderick, and by Ten next Morning (the 2d) the Bombketches began to play upon the Town-The fame Evening another Channel was made through the Wrecks, to the Eastward of the Shoal that lay in the Mouth of the Harbour; three of the Fireships got through that Channel, and were posted to cover the Descent of the Land Forces at Texar de Gracias; and they kept firing upon the Enemy whetever they faw them endeavouring to intrench themselves. On the 3d the Wey. mouth Capt. Knowles got through the Weftern Channel, and the next Night palled round the Shoal to the Eastern Part of the Harbour. The Cruizer got in at the other Channel the 4th in the Evening, and the Admiral posted them so round the Eastern Parts of the Harbour, that their Fire scoured the Country all round, and drove about an hundred of the Enemy from a Breaftwork at the upper End of the Harbour; and the Weymouth's Guns fcoured the Country between that and St. Lazar, by which Means we procured a fecure Descent to the Land Forces, who began to land on the 5th by Break of Day,

General Wentworth with about 1500 Men, advanced through a long narrow Defilé, where he had some few Men hurt by fingle Shot from the Paths and Openings into the Wood. In coming out of the Defilé, the Enemy (about 600) were perceived to be advantageoufly posted to dispute the Pallage : But the General immediately advanced upon them, received their Fire

without much Lofs, and forced them to retire, with Precipitation, and without Delay posselfed himself of a convenient Piece of Ground for forming the Camp a finall Mile from the Caftle of St. Lazar. That Evening and the Day following (the 6th) the Re-mainder of the Eight Regiments, and of Bland's and Lord James Cavendifh's, and two Battallions of the Americans came on Shore, making in the whole about 4000 Men; but they were obliged to lie three Nights upon their Arms for the Want of Tents and Tools, which could not be landed with them. The Troops growing fickly, and the rainy Seafon approaching, which would not admit of the Time necellary for raifing a Cannon Battery, it was refolved, in a Council of War, to attack St. Lazar as foon as might be, the Enemy being daily throwing up new Works; which Attack could not be made before the 9th; when, about 1 200 Men under the Command of Brigadier-General Guife advanced to the Fort a little before Break of Day. They began the Attack in two Places, the Grenadiers who were the most advanced, immediately entred the Enemy's Works ; but the most forward of them were almost all killed; and fresh Numbers pouring upon them from the Town, and the Enemy playing very briskly upon them with Grape Shot, the General was obliged to order a Retreat; to cover which, he directed a Referve of 500 Men to advance; by which Means they retired with-out any farther Lofs, and carried off great Part of the wounded Men. In this Attack upwards of 600 Men (Officers included) were killed or wounded. At the fame Time Sickness fell for heavily upon the Troops, that near 500 Men fickned or died by the 15th ; amongst the former were almost all the principal Officers: Upon which the General called a Council of War, to whom it appeared, that the Troops were fo far from being in a Condition to offend the Enemy, that they had fcarcely Duty-Men fufficient for the ordinary Guards of the Camp, and many of them in a very languifhing Condition : Befides which, they were threatned with the Want of Water, all the Cefterns from which the Camp had been supplied, being near exhausted; in Confequence of which, it was refolved in a General Council of War, composed of Sea and Land-Officers, to reimbark the Troops, which was done the 16th in the Evening, without any Loss.

The Spanish Admiral-Ship the Galicia was got up to Castillo Grande on the 8th, and the Admiral fent 60 Carpenters on board her, to fit her for a Battery against the Town.
