P R E S E N T,

The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

His Majesty having been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable Benjamin Earl Fitz Walter to be Lord Lieutenant of the County of Essex, his Lordship this Day took the Oaths appointed to be taken thereupon, instead of the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy.

This Day the Right Honourable William Fortescue, Esq; Master of the Rolls, was, by his Majesty's Command, sworn of his Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

Whereas in and by an Act of Parliament of the last Sessions, entitled, "An Act to prohibit for a Time therein limited, the Exportation of Corn, Grain, (Rice excepted) Meal, Malt, Flower, Bread, Biscuit, Starch, Beef, Pork, and Bacon." The Exportation out of this Kingdom of Corn, Meal, Malt, and other Things, is prohibited till the 25th of December, 1741, under the Penalties therein mentioned, but with such Exceptions and Proviso's as are therein contained: And whereas Power is given to his Majesty, when he shall judge it beneficial to the Kingdom, to take off that Prohibition, and permit the Exportation of all or any of those Commodities, by Proclamation, with the Advice of his Privy Council, or by Order in Council to be published in the Gazette. And whereas by reason of the plentiful Harvest last Summer, the Price of most Sorts of Corn and Grain is greatly fallen, and it is judged beneficial to the Kingdom, and the Trade and Navigation thereof, to permit the free Exportation thereof, Oats and Beans excepted: It is, by the King's most Excellent Majesty in Council, ordered, That it shall and may be lawful from henceforth, notwithstanding the Prohibition in the said Act contained, to and for all and every Person and Persons, Natives and Foreigners, to export and carry out of this Kingdom, to any Place or Places what-

soever, in the same Manner, and subject to the same Restrictions and Regulations as they might legally have done, if the said Act had not been made, and no otherwise, all Sorts of Corn, Grain, Meal, Malt, Flower, Bread, Biscuit, and Starch, excepting Oats and Beans, &c. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of his Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain. *J. Vernon.*

Presbourg, November 15, N. S. Prince Lobkowitz will join the Austrian Army as this Day, at Konigsfeld. Tomorrow they will march to Neuhause. It is said that the main force of the French and Bavarians is at Budowitz. And it is certain that two Bavarian Regiments are returned into their own Country. The Queen has declared, that her Chanceries shall begin to be removed from hence by Water on the 28th instant, and her Majesty proposes to follow to Vienna early in the next Month.

Vienna, November 15, N. S. The last Letters from the Queen's Army are dated from Frating the 13th Instant. The whole Army was to be at Zlubing in Bohemia on the 14th, where the Great Duke was to meet them. The two Regiments Waldeck and Molk had joined the Army under the Command of the Generals Gersuck and Tornaw. The four Regiments of Hussars, Karoli, Spleni, Ghylan and Defeffi, have been sent forwards as a Vanguard to the Army. Prince Lobkowitz was still with his Corps at Humpotetz. The Enemy, who was near Tabur, Wesely and Neuhause, is said to have retired, though no body could tell where. The Marquis de Bartholomey, who resided many Years here under the late Emperor as Envoy from the two last Dukes of Tuscany, and who has been made Privy Counsellor of the Queen and the present Great Duke, set out last Sunday for Turin.

Hubertsburg, Nov. 17, N. S. M. Podewitz, his Prussian Majesty's chief Minister for the Dispatch of foreign Business, is expected here

here ~~to~~ tomorrow, on his Return from Silesia to Berlin, being charged with a Letter from his Master to his Polish Majesty: 'Tis thought his Stay here will be but short, his Prussian Majesty having been at Berlin ever since the 10th Instant. When Count Lynar had his Audience of Leave of the Regent of Russia, she said, that as the King of Poland had honoured many of the Czar's Subjects with the Order of the White Eagle, she desired that his Polish Majesty would confer that of St. Andrew on any one of his own Subjects; accordingly M. Rex of the Privy Council was invested with the same. M. d'Utterodt has passed by here for Dresden, the Time of his Return to England being yet unsettled. M. Valori, the French Minister at the Court of Prussia, arrived here from Breslaw on the 14th Instant, and intended to pursue his Journey the next Morning to Berlin; but being informed that Marshal Belleisle was soon expected here, he proposes to stay till his Arrival, which it is thought will be in a very few Days. Soon after General Renard, who had been ordered to march with his Column of near 5000 Men along the other Side of the Elbe as a Convoy to the Barges sent with Artillery from Dresden for the Siege of Prague, and the Use of the French, had taken up his Quarters at Leuthmeritz; Prince Leopold of Dessau sent a Battallion of Prussians thither, which he refused to admit into the Place. The Light Horse from Poland is now arrived in Lusatia, and are to remain in those Countries to help to defend them against any Incursions of the Austrian Hussars.

Copenhagen, Nov. 10, 1741. N. S. Last Week a Swedish Man of War seized a Dutch Vessel in the Categat, with Herrings and Cloth on board, bound for Riga; and having brought her through the Sound, has carried her to Stockholm. On Thursday the 20th Instant the King and Queen of Denmark, with all the Royal Family, returned out of the Country to Christiansbourg, the new Palace in this City, where they have taken up their Residence for the Winter. The same Day arrived here the Marquis de Perto on his Way to Stockholm, as did Yesterday in the Evening M. de Laumari, the former being the Spanish, and the latter the French Minister appointed for the Court of Sweden.
